What is a Data and Statistics Volunteer?

Cumbria Wildlife Trust produces lots of data from the many project it works on. From vegetation on Foulshaw, to breeding birds on Rockcliffe, we have masses of data to record the work we do. However, the staff do not always have time to analyse this, especially once the project ends. This role will help the Trust better understand its land management and the value of our work, lead to better conservation outcomes and raise the Trust's profile and reputation, particularly if this work could lead to the writing up and publishing of results.

- -make a difference by helping the Trust better achieve conservation outcomes.
- -learn how Trust works and gain valuable experience working for a conservation charity.
