About Cumbria Wildlife Trust

What is a DIY volunteer?

Do you enjoy hands-on projects and working with wood? We're looking for DIY-minded volunteers to help maintain and improve Plumgarths Gardens. Tasks include repairing our pond boardwalk, restoring benches, building a welly boot rack, and creating essential structures for our tree nursery—such as raised beds, cold frames, and workbenches.

No formal carpentry experience is required, but confidence with tools and DIY skills are. Your practical ability, guidance, and ideas will be invaluable in shaping a space that supports both people and nature. We provide the materials, space, and tools—you bring your skills and enthusiasm!

What will you do as a Reserves Ambassador?

- Attend for half a day, up to two days per week
- Respond to the needs of the gardener, repairing and making things for Plumgarths garden
- Support the development of the tree nursery
- Work around other volunteers in the garden, and potentially offer support

What's in it for you?

- Becoming part of a friendly and dedicated team at Cumbria Wildlife Trust
- Health and wellbeing benefits by making new friends and making a difference in your local community
- Being at the heart of work to develop the site for nature and support the growth of trees for the Skiddaw project
- Early knowledge of developments around the site and other opportunities
- Access to training

Health and Safety

DIY can involve some level of risk and our staff will work with you, taking any necessary precautions to minimise this risk. As a volunteer, we'll ensure you are fully trained and it will be your responsibility as a volunteer to comply to Trust policies and safety procedures in practice.



This will include:

- First aid training
- CWT and Site induction
- Site risk assessments and health and safety training, including lone working options if necessary
- All necessary tools, equipment and resources provided in a good working order
- PPE provided

We recommend that any volunteers taking part in conservation work have an up-to-date tetanus jab.

Who would suit this role?

This role will suit anyone interested in volunteering with Cumbria Wildlife Trust, who is practical and able to problem solve. The site can be sociable and it offers the chance to be part of a community, though there is the option to work at quieter times. It would especially suit those with:

- Reasonable level of physical fitness
- Aged 16 or over
- Willingness to work outdoors
- Ability to work as part of a team
- Confident communicating with others
- Ability to listen and follow instructions
- · Awareness and understanding of risk in relation to tools and practical work
- Ability to comply to all policies and procedures put in place

Previous experience of training in practical conservation work is not required for this role but if you do have any of the following or any other previous experience or skills that would benefit our volunteer group, please let our reserve officer know:

- Previous practical conservation work experience
- A valid first aid certificate (please provide certificate)
